



Penmachno Hall



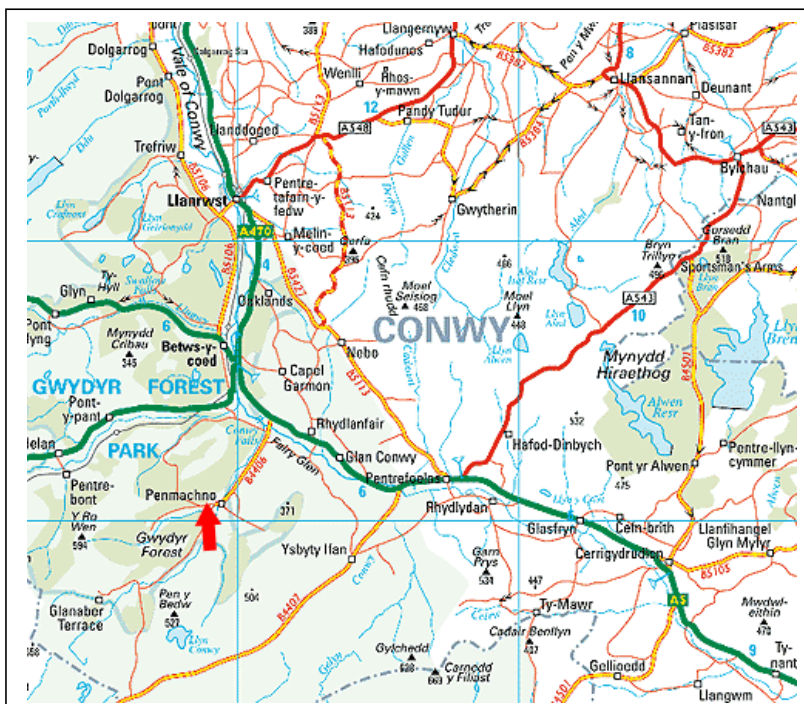
A former Rectory dating from 1862, Penmachno Hall is set in an acre of private grounds, comprising spinney and landscaped gardens fronted by the Glasgwm River.

Situated in the heart of the Snowdonia National Park, within 5 minutes drive of the tourist centre of Betws-y-Coed, Penmachno Hall offers the discerning visitor the opportunity to be within easy reach of all the major tourist attractions whilst at the same time enjoying the seclusion that the largely undiscovered Glasgwm valley has to offer. With its breathtaking views, quiet forest tracks, stepping stones and secret waterfalls, the valley is a haven of tranquillity compared to the bustle of Betws-y-Coed.

Offering Country House-style accommodation, the 3 spacious bedrooms are all en-suite and benefit from panoramic views of the gardens and surrounding countryside. The two visitor reception rooms, the Morning Room and Dining Room have open log and coal fires. Freshly prepared meals accompanied by a large selection of excellent wines are a speciality.

We also offer special breaks with a variety of themes including Wine Appreciation, Welsh Language, Horse Riding, Artists Breaks, and Mountain Biking. Or you may just want to relax and explore the area at your own pace using Penmachno as an ideal base. Whatever your choice, we will do our best to make your stay one to remember.

How to find us



Take the Penmachno Road (B4406) from the A5 by the Conwy Falls Café (pink building!) following the brown tourist signs for Ty Mawr.

On arriving at the centre of Penmachno cross the bridge and continue to the Eagles Pub. Still following signs for Ty Mawr take the turning directly alongside the pub.

Penmachno Hall will be seen straight ahead after the Rectory Bridge (Pont Ceunant).
