



Penmachno Hall



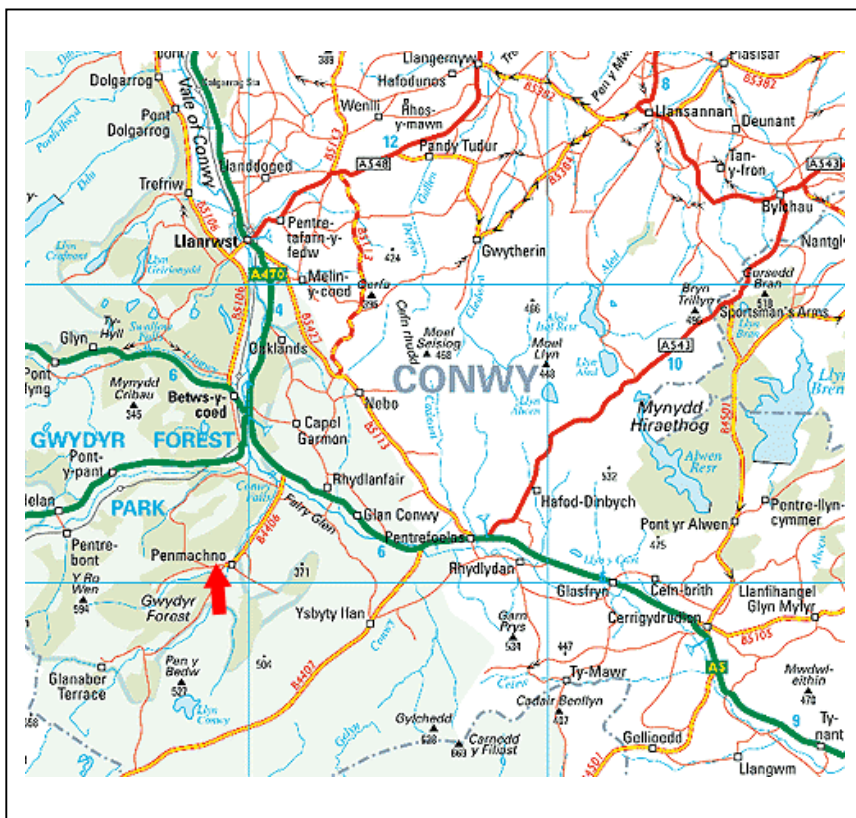
A former Rectory dating from 1862, Penmachno Hall is set in 2 acres of private grounds, comprising spinney and landscaped garden fronted by the Glasgwm River.

Situated in the heart of the Snowdonia National Park, just 4 miles from the tourist centre of Betws-y-Coed, Penmachno Hall offers the discerning visitor the opportunity to be within easy reach of all the major tourist attractions, whilst at the same time enjoying the seclusion that the largely undiscovered Glasgwm valley has to offer. With its breathtaking views, quiet forest tracks, stepping stones and secret waterfalls, the valley is a haven of tranquillity within easy reach of bustling Betws-y-Coed.

Offering Country House-style accommodation, the 3 spacious bedrooms are all en-suite and benefit from panoramic views of the garden and surrounding countryside. The two guest reception rooms, the Morning Room and Dining Room, have open log and coal fires for chilly nights. Freshly prepared meals accompanied by a selection of excellent wines are a speciality.

There is a wide range of tourism information at Penmachno Hall including a large selection of pamphlets and walking books and maps. Lauraine and Simon have even written their "Top 10" things to see and do whilst in the area, based on 15 years of having lived locally.

How to find us



OS Grid reference SH 707 586 GB

Take the Penmachno Road (B4406) from the A5 by the Conwy Falls Café following the brown tourist signs for Ty Mawr.

On arriving at the centre of Penmachno cross the bridge and continue to the Eagles Pub. Still following signs for Ty Mawr take the turning directly along the right hand side of the pub (almost straight ahead of you).

Penmachno Hall will be seen straight ahead after the Rectory Bridge (Pont Ceunant).
